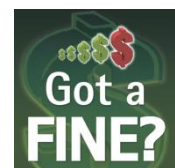
Do you work with vulnerable people?

We offer staff training to help you understand the law; identify when your clients might have a legal problem; direct your clients to reliable information about the law; and know when and where to refer them for legal help.

<p>Got a fine? training</p> <p>This session shows you how to negotiate a Time To Pay Arrangement with the Fines Recovery Unit. Training includes a copy of the <i>Got a fine?</i> kit.</p>	<p>Legal information training</p> <p>Learn about why access to information about the law is important and how it can help your clients. This session also includes information about NT Legal Aid and how to access legal services.</p>
<p>Family Harmony Program</p> <p>Training for CALD communities or service providers who work with CALD communities. Topics covered include family law, domestic and family violence, and child protection.</p>	<p>What’s the Law?</p> <p>For newly arrived migrants or service providers working with CALD communities. Topics include the legal system, driving/cars, police, renting, Centrelink, and family law.</p>
<p>Blurred Borders training (bail and criminal processes or family violence)</p> <p>For professionals supporting clients with bail or criminal problems, or victims/perpetrators of domestic and family violence. Use visual aids to talk to clients and explain concepts and processes. Fees may apply for copies of the kit.</p>	<p>Introduction to NT Legal Aid</p> <p>An introductory session about NT Legal Aid— what we do, what area of laws we cover, and how to access our services.</p>
